

YACHTING COMEBACK ENLIVENS REGATTA

Veteran Former Commodore
Ellis Outsails Younger Skip-
pers in Ten-Meter Race.

WINS BY TWO MINUTES

His Dragon Followed by Twilight
and Narcissus in American
Y. C. Event.

RYE, N. Y., July 2.—The theory that "they don't come back," which is being so widely exploited, in regard to various sports, was not borne out today in the annual regatta of the American Yacht Club, when former Commodore Ralph Ellis of the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club, won the race in the ten meter class with his sloop Dragon.

Commodore Ellis has been sailing races in the Sound for over forty years. He sailed in the original fifty foot class and other notable racing units, but of recent years had not sailed in the larger classes. He built one of the new ten meters, however, and today, pitted against many of the crack junior skippers on Long Island Sound, won a handsome victory.

Dragon won by almost two minutes from Vice Commodore C. D. Mallory's Twilight in the ten meter class, with Frank Page's Narcissus less than a minute astern of Twilight.

There were twelve starters in the class, two of the ten meters having gone East to race on the cruise of the Eastern yacht clubs.

110 Yachts in Regatta.

A fine fleet of 110 yachts raced in the American Yacht Club Regatta, which was started in a good breeze from the southeast, which shifted to east, and northeast, as rain squalls, breaking over the course at intervals, caused shifts in the wind.

The largest sloops to race were the Larchmont O boats, which, like the ten meters and the others of the larger yachts, sailed a triangular course of 16 1/2 miles. The winner in the Larchmont class was the Celerita, owned by Kendall Hester, which had a close squeeze to beat out T. J. S. Flint's Mirage, with Bob Mahlstadt's Nimbus only 45 seconds astern of Mirage.

In the New York Yacht Club thirty foot class Vice Commodore Ogden Reid's Lena won her first race of the season, finishing less than a minute ahead of S. C. Pirie's Oriole.

Commodore Reid's power yacht Porpoise was the committee boat, and the loud cheers of the Filipino steward on the Porpoise, when the Lena finished in front greatly disturbed the committee members.

Hoyt Leads Six Meters

A fine class of 13 international six meter yachts came out to race for the prize offered by Vice Commodore Reid and after a brisk contest over a ten-mile triangle the Lanai, sailed by C. Sherman Hoyt, one of the crack Long Island Sound skippers, and a noted winner in the six meter class, finished in front.

Lanai was less than a minute ahead of H. B. Plant's Clytie, one of the new boats of the year, with Johnston Deforest's Priscilla, another of the new division, third.

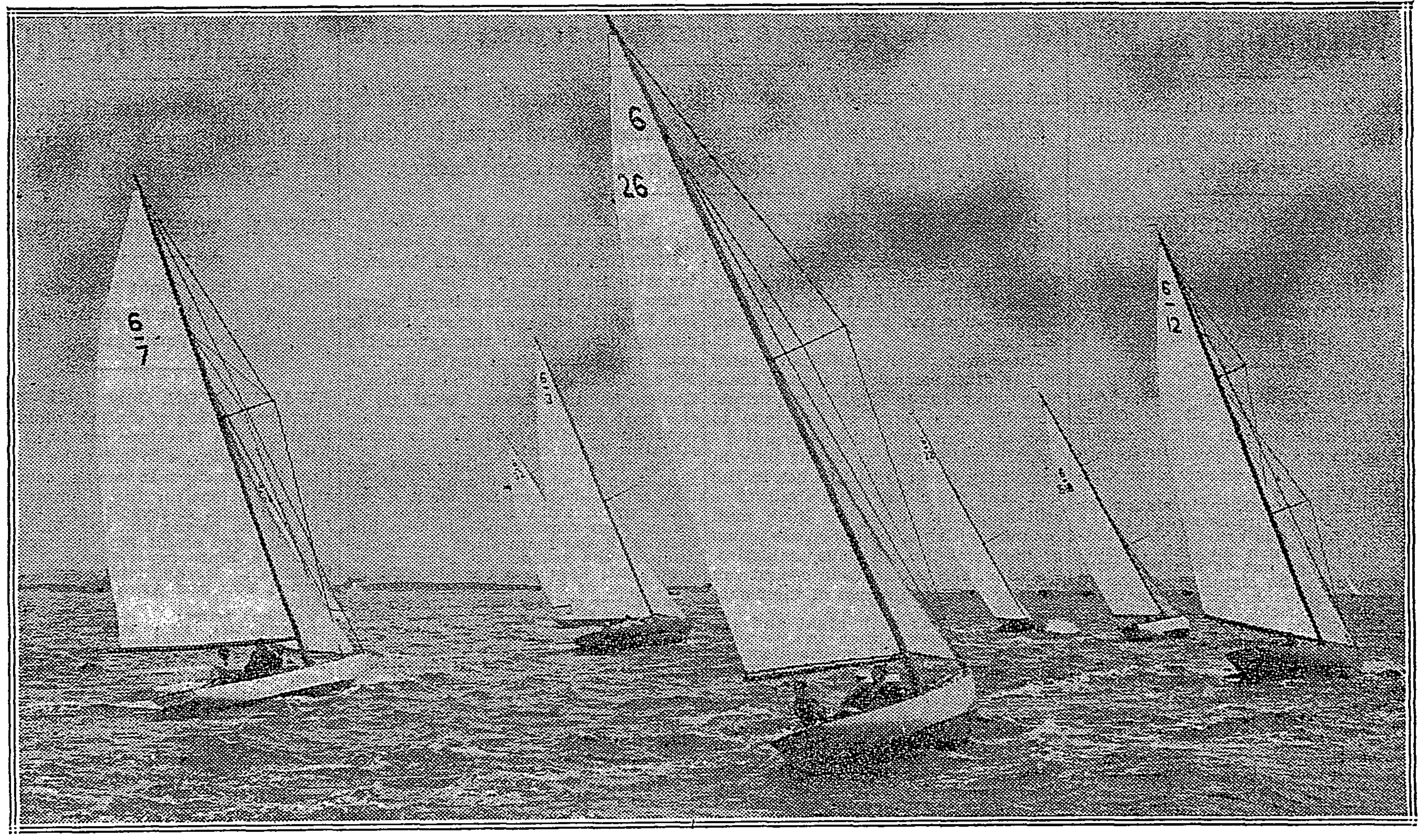
